




2 Passenger vehicle registrations crossed a fresh milestone

3 India's 18% US tariff rate undercuts South-East Asian Rivals


India has now the lowest tariff rates among South East Asian countries

4 Global energy prices have plunged


The IMF fossil fuel index currently is at similar level as it was 20 years ago


Share of flexi workers have increased to 70% from 20% in 5 years

India's residential market is now among the top-10 globally in terms of growth in housing prices





9 China now operates the second largest nuclear submarine fleet


India only has 2 fleets vs 32 for China and 71 for US
